About this republication

The republished law

This is a republication of the *Magistrates Court (Dangerous Goods Road Transport Infringement Notices) Regulation 2010*, made under the *Magistrates Court Act 1930* (including any amendment made under the *Legislation Act 2001*, part 11.3 (Editorial changes)) as in force on 29 October 2010. It also includes any commencement, repeal or expiry affecting the republished law.

The legislation history and amendment history of the republished law are set out in endnotes 3 and 4.

Kinds of republications

The Parliamentary Counsel's Office prepares 2 kinds of republications of ACT laws (see the ACT legislation register at www.legislation.act.gov.au):

- authorised republications to which the *Legislation Act 2001* applies
- unauthorised republications.

The status of this republication appears on the bottom of each page.

Editorial amendments

The *Legislation Act 2001*, part 11.3 authorises the Parliamentary Counsel to make editorial amendments and other changes of a formal nature when preparing a law for republication. Editorial changes do not change the effect of the law, but have effect as if they had been made by an Act commencing on the republication date (see *Legislation Act 2001*, s 115 and s 117). The changes are made if the Parliamentary Counsel considers they are desirable to bring the law into line, or more closely into line, with current legislative drafting practice.

This republication does not include amendments made under part 11.3 (see endnote 1).

Uncommenced provisions and amendments

If a provision of the republished law has not commenced or is affected by an uncommenced amendment, the symbol $\boxed{\mathbf{U}}$ appears immediately before the provision heading. The text of the uncommenced provision or amendment appears only in the last endnote.

Modifications

If a provision of the republished law is affected by a current modification, the symbol **M** appears immediately before the provision heading. The text of the modifying provision appears in the endnotes. For the legal status of modifications, see *Legislation Act* 2001, section 95.

Penalties

At the republication date, the value of a penalty unit for an offence against this law is \$110 for an individual and \$550 for a corporation (see *Legislation Act 2001*, s 133).

1 Name of regulation

This regulation is the Magistrates Court (Dangerous Goods Road Transport Infringement Notices) Regulation 2010.

3 Dictionary

The dictionary at the end of this regulation is part of this regulation.

Note 1 The dictionary at the end of this regulation defines certain terms used in this regulation.

Note 2 A definition in the dictionary applies to the entire regulation unless the definition, or another provision of the regulation, provides otherwise or the contrary intention otherwise appears (see Legislation Act, s 155 and s 156 (1)).

4 Notes

A note included in this regulation is explanatory and is not part of this regulation.

Note See the Legislation Act, s 127 (1), (4) and (5) for the legal status of notes.

5 Purpose of regulation

The purpose of this regulation is to create a system of infringement notices under the *Magistrates Court Act 1930*, part 3.8 for certain offences against the dangerous goods legislation.

Note The Magistrates Court Act 1930, pt 3.8 provides a system of infringement notices for offences against various Acts. The infringement notice system is intended to provide an alternative to prosecution.

6 Administering authority—Act, s 117

The administering authority for an infringement notice offence against the dangerous goods legislation is the entity declared to be the competent authority for the *Dangerous Goods (Road Transport) Act 2009*, section 20.

7 Infringement notice offences—Act, s 117

The *Magistrates Court Act 1930*, part 3.8 applies to an offence against a provision of the dangerous goods legislation mentioned in schedule 1, column 2.

8 Infringement notice penalties—Act, s 117

- (1) The penalty payable by an individual for an offence against the dangerous goods legislation, under an infringement notice for the offence, is the amount mentioned in schedule 1, column 4 for the offence.
- (2) The penalty payable by a corporation for an offence against the dangerous goods legislation, under an infringement notice for the offence, is 5 times the amount mentioned in schedule 1, column 4 for the offence.
- (3) The cost of serving a reminder notice for an infringement notice offence against the dangerous goods legislation is \$34.

9 Contents of infringement notices—identifying authorised person—Act, s 121 (1) (g)

An infringement notice served on a person by an authorised person for an infringement notice offence against the dangerous goods legislation must identify the authorised person by—

- (a) for an authorised person who is a police officer—the police officer's service number; or
- (b) for an authorised person appointed under the *Dangerous Goods* (*Road Transport*) *Act 2009*, section 23 (2)—
 - (i) the authorised person's full name, or surname and initials; or
 - (ii) the authorised person's identity card number.

10 Contents of infringement notices—other information—Act, s 121 (1) (h)

(1) An infringement notice served on a company by an authorised person for an infringement notice offence against the dangerous goods legislation must include the company's ACN.

Note The requirement under this section is additional to the requirement under the *Magistrates Court Act 1930*, s 121 (1) (c).

(2) In this section:

company means a company registered under the Corporations Act.

11 Contents of reminder notice—identifying authorised person—Act, s 130 (f)

A reminder notice served on a person by an authorised person for an infringement notice offence against the dangerous goods legislation must identify the authorised person by—

- (a) for an authorised person who is a police officer—the police officer's service number; or
- (b) for an authorised person appointed under the *Dangerous Goods* (*Road Transport*) *Act* 2009, section 23 (2)—
 - (i) the authorised person's full name, or surname and initials; or
 - (ii) the authorised person's identity card number.

Authorised people for infringement notice offences—Act, s 134A (2)

An authorised person under the *Dangerous Goods (Road Transport) Act 2009*, section 23 may serve—

(a) an infringement notice for an infringement notice offence against the dangerous goods legislation; and

Magistrates Court (Dangerous Goods Road Transport Infringement Notices) Regulation 2010 Effective: 29/10/10-09/06/15 (b) a reminder notice for an infringement notice offence against the dangerous goods legislation.

Note Police officers and people appointed by the competent authority are authorised people under the *Dangerous Goods (Road Transport)*Act 2009, s 23.
