This regulation is the *Road Transport (Vehicle Registration) Amendment Regulation 2014 (No 1)*.

2 Commencement

This regulation commences on the day after its notification day.

Note The naming and commencement provisions automatically commence on the notification day (see [Legislation Act](#), s 75 (1)).

This regulation amends the *Road Transport (Vehicle Registration) Regulation 2000*.

- (i) deficiencies in the vehicle may be a safety risk if allowed to continue after the time and date stated in the notice; or
- (ii) the vehicle does not comply with—
 - (A) section 59 (Display of numberplates); or
 - (B) schedule 1, section 1.92 (Numberplate lights); or
 - (C) schedule 1, section 1.120 (Other lights and reflectors).
